

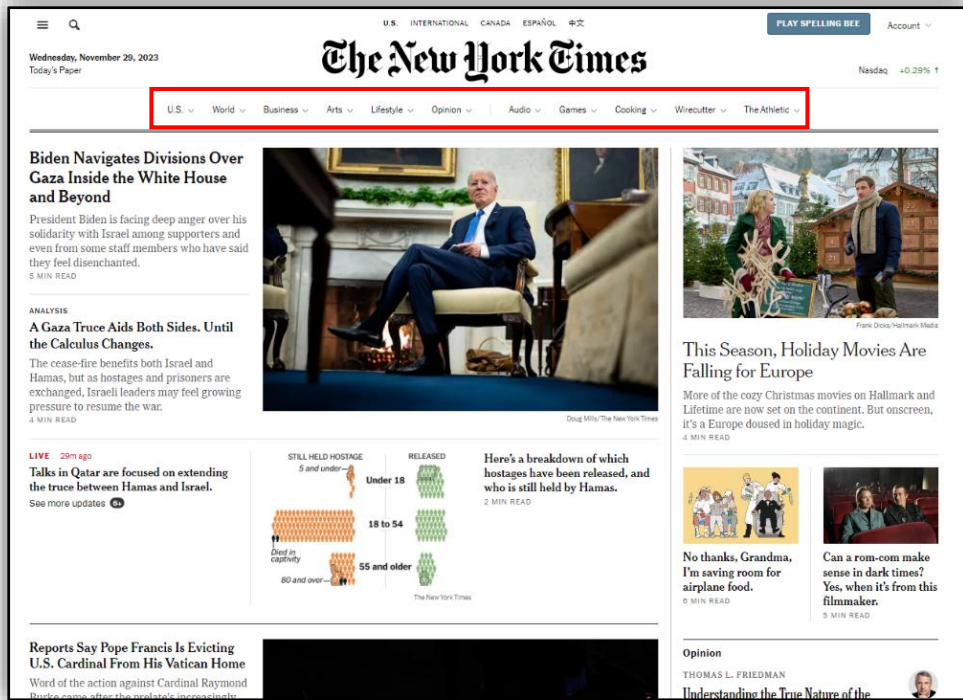
**Accessing Content:** Visit the New York Times website at [www.nytimes.com](http://www.nytimes.com)
